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92 Giacomo Ascheri Barolo Pisapola 2007 \$45

Classically proportioned, with cherry, licorice, eucalyptus and tobacco flavors married to a chewy texture. This is elegant and well-toned at once, with a hint of truffle on the finish. Very harmonious. Best from 2014 through 2028. 850 cases made.—B.S.

90 Giacomo Ascheri Barolo 2007 \$40

A vein of licorice is augmented by cherry, plum and tar in this chewy red, which is fresh and balanced, with a firmness to the lingering finish, where licorice and spice notes resonate. Best from 2014 through 2024. 2,000 cases made.—B.S.

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93 Giacomo Ascheri Barolo Sorano Coste & Bricco 2007 \$75

Starts rich, showing cherry, eucalyptus and menthol notes backed by firm tannins. Linear and tight, with a light char accent on the moderately long finish. A more elegant style from Serralunga. Best from 2015 through 2030. 375 cases made.—B.S.

92 Giacomo Ascheri Barolo Sorano 2007 \$55

A cooked fruit aroma and rich, jammy palate of cherry, plum and tar highlight this round Barolo. This should win many fans for its lush texture and supple tannins. Tar and bitter herb accents grace the finish. Best from 2013 through 2029. 1,100 cases made.—B.S.
